Abstract Submission Guidelines

SUBMISSIONS

Both the resubmission of abstracts previously submitted for EPICOH 2020 and new abstracts are welcome. For previously submitted abstracts, after entering the abstract information, please check the box to indicate that this is a resubmission.

PRESENTATION TYPE

Authors may indicate, at the time of submission, whether they wish their abstract to be considered for one of the following presentation types:

- Oral
- Poster
- Oral or Poster
- Symposium (this abstract is part of an already accepted symposium for 2021)

LANGUAGE

Abstracts must be submitted in English.

ABSTRACT TITLE (200 characters)

Abstract titles must be a maximum of 200 characters including spaces. Please use sentence case (capitalizing only the first word and any proper nouns).

AUTHOR NAMES

First name(s) and last name(s). Full names are preferred to initials.

AUTHOR AFFILIATIONS

Include the primary institution and country, of each author. Author affiliations should be indicated by superscript numbers, e.g. *Frank Moran¹, John Bradley². ¹University of Ulster; N. Ireland; ²Belfast City Hospital, N. Ireland.

Please identify the presenter with an asterisk.

ABSTRACT CONTENT (300 words)

The content of the abstract must be less than 300 words in the content field, and should be structured to include the following headings: Introduction, Objectives, Methods, Results, Conclusion.

ABBREVIATIONS

All abbreviations should be defined at first mention and may be used in the title, as long as the name in full is outlined in the body of the abstract.

PRESENTER COMMUNICATIONS

Please note that all correspondence regarding the abstract will be addressed to the submitting author. Therefore, we highly recommend that the PRESENTING author's profile is used for submitting an abstract.

REGISTRATION DEADLINE

In order to confirm your presentation in the program, the presenting author must register and pay the registration fee by **August 8, 2021** to ensure placement in the program. Any presenter changes can be communicated to the conference secretariat at vicki@f2fe.com.

STUDENTS AND EARLY CAREER RESEARCHERS

Please identify if the presenter is a student, postdoctoral fellow, resident and/or has graduated in 2016 or later. These are eligible to be considered for conference awards and will also receive information about conference activities for Early Career Researchers.

GENDER-BASED RESEARCH

In addition to general awards for early career researchers, this year special awards will be offered for gender-based research conducted by trainees and early career researchers. These awards are made possible by the Canadian Institutes of Health - Sex and Gender Science Chair in Cancer Research in collaboration with the Université de Montréal. To identify abstracts that are eligible for these awards, please check the box indicating that the work reported in the abstract takes gender into consideration.

PUBLICATION

An abstract can only be submitted when agreeing to the submission terms. The terms state that accepted abstracts will be published in a supplement of Occupational and Environmental Medicine (OEM) and that all authors agree to the [Licence to BMJ Publishing Group Ltd \("BMJ"\) for publication of conference abstracts](#). The abstracts will also be available in the conference WebApp for a duration of 3 months. If the authors refuse publication of the abstract, they must inform the conference secretariat at vicki@f2fe.com as soon as the abstract is submitted.
