

Pilot Project for training in health and safety at work in Spanish 2021.

Currently, we are developing a pilot project for training in health and safety at work in Spanish led by WHWB with the participation of OHTA, in which we want to invite experts in the area of health and safety at work to join as tutors in Spanish language according to the topics that make up the course listed below.

Here are some important topics for tutors to keep in mind about this training:

- They will receive certification for their collaboration with the project.
- The study material for the participants is found in English on the OHTA - Occupational Hygiene Training Association website.
- Each tutor is required to make a video with an explanation of the topic of maximum 20 minutes, in Spanish.
- One (1) day a week will be selected to hold a 1-hour meeting (the date and time will be confirmed later) through the zoom platform, where the participants' doubts about the study material and videos will be exposed.
- The tutor can also use this time to share real experiences. The goal is for these 1-hour zoom sessions to discuss 3 topics.
- **Deadline to participate:** August 09, 2021. Send an email relating to the topic of interest.
- **Estimated start date of the course:** During the month of September 2021.
